

Pantun Playground: Fostering Nature Appreciation and Life Lessons for Children in "Rimba Pantun"

"*Pantun*" is a traditional form of Malay poetry that has been cherished for generations due to its rhythmic and lyrical qualities (Salleh, 2023). Typically composed of four lines, a *pantun* follows a specific rhyming pattern and syllabic structure, with the first and second lines rhyming with each other, and the third and fourth lines rhyming similarly. Each line typically consists of eight to twelve syllables. This poetic form often incorporates imagery, metaphor, and wordplay to convey messages, explore themes, or offer advice.

In *pantun*, children will discover rhythmic verses composed of four lines, each with its own unique rhyming pattern and syllabic structure. Through *pantun*, children can immerse themselves in the wonders of nature while also learning valuable lessons and advice (Tarwiyani et al., 2020; Zamani & Abd Gani, 2020). These poetic expressions often convey messages about environmental conservation, appreciation for wildlife, and the beauty of the natural world. By engaging with *pantun*, children not only enhance their language and creative skills but also gain insights into the importance of preserving our environment and living in harmony with nature (Osip & Taisin, 2019).

Looking into children's literature, the potential for fostering a deep connection with nature and instilling moral values through poetry remains largely untapped in the digital landscape (Aji et al., 2023). Traditional forms of poetry, particularly the Southeast Asian *pantun*, offer a rich cultural and literary heritage that has the power to captivate young minds. However, the challenges lie in translating these poetic traditions into a digital format that not only preserves their cultural essence but also engages contemporary, tech-savvy young readers (Zulkarnain et al., 2021).

The absence of a dedicated platform that seamlessly integrates the age-old art of *pantun* with modern technology restricts the accessibility of this cultural treasure to a broader audience of children. Furthermore, the scarcity of interactive and engaging applications focused on both nature exploration and moral guidance through poetry creates a void in the digital literary landscape for young readers.

Current digital literature applications for children often lack a specific focus on poetry and cultural heritage, presenting a gap in the offerings available for their literary enrichment (Nordiana et al., 2022). The prevailing trend towards more interactive and immersive learning experiences suggests an opportunity to harness technology for introducing children to the beauty of *pantun* poetry while fostering an appreciation for nature and imparting valuable life advice (Wang et al., 2023). Thus, the research problem centers on the need to develop a Children's Poetry Repository Application, specifically tailored to explore nature and offer advice through *pantun* verses, addressing the challenges of cultural preservation, technological integration, and interactive learning in the context of children's literature.

The primary question is how to design and implement a digital platform that not only brings the captivating times of *pantun* to life but also effectively integrates with contemporary reading habits, promoting both cultural literacy and engaging educational experiences for young readers. This research endeavors to develop a mobile application that serves as a repository of children's poetry centered around themes of nature exploration and moral guidance.

In the research project "*Rimba Pantun*," a children's poetry repository application is developed with the aim of fostering an appreciation for nature and providing guidance through *pantun*. Through this application, children can explore various *pantun* related to nature, offering insights into environmental conservation, appreciation for biodiversity, and words of wisdom. By engaging with these poetic expressions, children not only develop their linguistic and creative skills but also deepen their understanding of the natural world and the importance of preserving nature for the future generations.

Children today are increasingly exposed to digital media, yet many lack opportunities to engage meaningfully with cultural heritage and the natural environment. This issue highlights the urgent need for creative educational tools that not only entertain but also nurture values, imagination, and ecological awareness. The *Rimba Pantun* project addresses this gap by reintroducing the traditional art of *pantun* in a modern, interactive format. By fostering children's appreciation for nature and imparting life lessons through poetry, the application responds to both educational and cultural needs. Its relevance lies in preserving and revitalizing *pantun* as an indigenous literary form while adapting it to contemporary digital platforms for young learners.

The study is significant because it demonstrates how technology can be harnessed for cultural transmission, moral education, and creative expression. Stakeholders such as educators, parents, cultural practitioners, and curriculum designers stand to benefit from this initiative, as it provides a ready-to-use resource that combines cultural enrichment with character development. Moreover, the practical utility of *Rimba Pantun* lies in its dual function as both a digital poetry repository and an interactive learning tool, offering children not only access to curated verses but also the opportunity to create and contribute their own works. This dual approach ensures that the project is not only theoretically valuable but also effective in promoting active learning, cultural continuity, and nature appreciation among young audiences.

Symbolism and Message of the Pantun

In the vibrant tapestry of Southeast Asian culture, *pantun* emerges as a captivating thread, weaving together the intricate rhythms of poetry with the rich tapestry of cultural heritage. Originating from the Malay Archipelago and spanning across regions including Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore, and Brunei, *pantun* embodies the essence of Southeast Asian identity and tradition. Passed down through generations, *pantun* holds a revered place as a cultural heritage, cherished for its lyrical beauty, moral wisdom, and timeless resonance (Sinar et al., 2020).

At its core, *pantun* is a poetic form characterized by its structured quatrain of rhymed verses, each line comprising of a fixed number of syllables. Beyond its formal structure, however, *pantun* encapsulates a multitude of themes, ranging from love and nature to folklore and philosophy (Rahman et al., 2022). Through its evocative imagery and poignant metaphors, *pantun* serves as a mirror reflecting the values, beliefs, and experiences of the communities that nurture it.

The creation of *pantun* reflects the sentiments and atmospheres in the life of Malay community as emphasized in the meaning of the selected terms in the lines (Ishak et al.,

2018). A *pantun* comprises a line of foreshadowing followed by a line conveying its meaning. Within the structure of *pantun*, the focus shifts towards nature and living entities, serving as predominant themes and symbols.

The utilization of nature elements such as plants and flowers in *pantun* poetry serves multiple purposes (Nirwana Sudirman et al., 2017). Firstly, these natural elements provide vivid imagery, evoking sensory experiences that enrich the poem's aesthetic appeal. Secondly, they symbolize various aspects of life, especially young man and young woman (Hassan et al., 2022), emotions, and human experiences, allowing for nuanced expressions and deeper meanings within the verses.

Additionally, by incorporating elements from the natural world, *pantun* fosters a sense of connection to the environment, encouraging reverence for nature and the ecosystems that sustain life (Maulana Al-Fin & Nor Hashimah, 2018). Finally, the use of nature imagery reflects cultural values and traditions, as many societies regard the natural world with reverence and imbue it with symbolic significance. Overall, the inclusion of plants and flowers in *pantun* adds depth, beauty, and cultural resonance to the poetry, enhancing its impact on both the poet and the audience (Maulana Al-Fin & Nor Hashimah, 2022).

An example of *pantun* that appears in Pak Nazel's *Pantun* Collection (Nazel Hashim 2012) displays the mutual relationship in Saga tree, *dedalu* flower and family unit (Judi et al., 2023). The analysis of the relationship between flora elements and their interpretations based on *pantuns* provides valuable insights into cultural symbolism, ecological awareness, and the human connection to nature (Nordiana & Nurul Ain, 2018).

The original *pantun* and the respective translation are as follow.

<i>Bawah redup pohon saga,</i>	Beneath the <i>saga</i> tree shadowy,
<i>Bunga dedalu jatuh bertebat;</i>	The <i>dedalu</i> flowers fall and scatter;
<i>Kalau hidup berjauhan keluarga,</i>	If you live far away from family,
<i>Berhubung selalu bertanya khabar.</i>	Keep in touch to feel better.
(Pak Nazel <i>Pantun</i> Keluarga: 106)	(Pak Nazel's Family <i>Pantun</i> : 106)

The *pantun* undergoes ecological scrutiny aimed at unraveling humanity's relationship with the ecological elements namely the saga tree and *dedalu* (Nur Salihah Mohamad & Jan Noor Muhammad, 2019). The proximity of these floral entities portrays the diverse ecological milieu where they coexist, sometimes harmoniously and at other times in competition for limited resources. The *dedalu* flower illustrates how individuals, despite physical distance, remain interdependent with the parents and family members. The essence of this *pantun* aims to counsel individuals living apart from their families, to maintain communication to uphold familial bonds despite physical distance (Salleh, 2018).

Methodology

The research methodology applies Agile Model (as in Figure 1) in the development of this game application. This is because this project is entirely the responsibility of the researcher as individual and the decision is made by individual. Furthermore, this project is a multimedia application, it is very likely that there will be little by little changes in the analysis and design part throughout the development process.

The development of the "*Rimba Pantun*: Children's Poetry Repository Application for Exploring Nature and Advice" research project will be guided by the Agile methodology, a flexible and iterative approach to software development. Agile methodology emphasizes collaboration, adaptability, and delivering value to customers through incremental development cycles.

The project starts by defining the project scope and objectives, gathering requirements from stakeholders, including children, educators, and cultural experts. The project backlog, consisting of user stories representing features and functionalities, will be created and prioritized based on their importance and feasibility. Sprint planning meetings will be held to select user stories for each iteration, ensuring that the team focuses on delivering the most valuable features first.

In addition to *pantun* books, the application features a special section dedicated to flora *pantun* (Figure 7), offering verses inspired by the diverse flora and fauna of Southeast Asia. The "Rimba Pantun" application also includes a section for *pantun* videos, as in Figure 8, offering an interactive and engaging way for children to experience *pantun* poetry through animated performances and storytelling. Users can watch videos featuring *pantun* recitations, performances, and educational content, further enhancing their understanding and enjoyment of *pantun* poetry. Additionally, the application features a comprehensive *pantun*

search function, allowing users to search for specific verses or themes, making it easy to find and explore their favorite *pantun* compositions, as in Figure 9.

To facilitate exploration and learning, the "*Rimba Pantun*" application includes a *pantun* division feature (Figure 10), allowing users to explore *pantun* verses categorized based on themes, authors, or historical periods. This division provides users with a structured approach to discovering *pantun* poetry, enabling them to delve deeper into specific topics or interests. Furthermore, the application incorporates interactive features such as quizzes, games, and educational activities, fostering engagement and learning among young users as they interact with *pantun* poetry and explore its cultural significance.

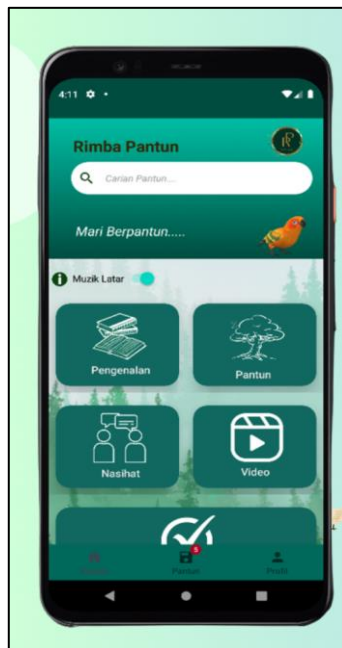
Figure 2 *Rimba Pantun* Login

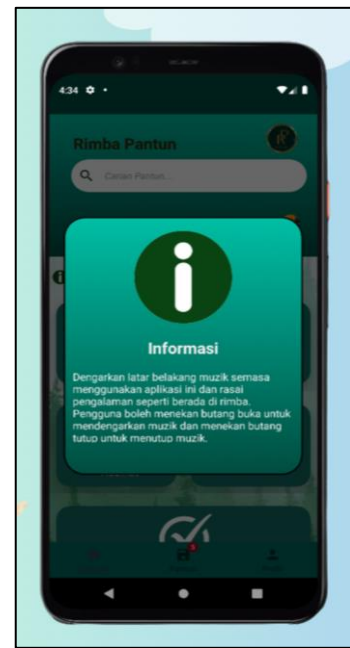
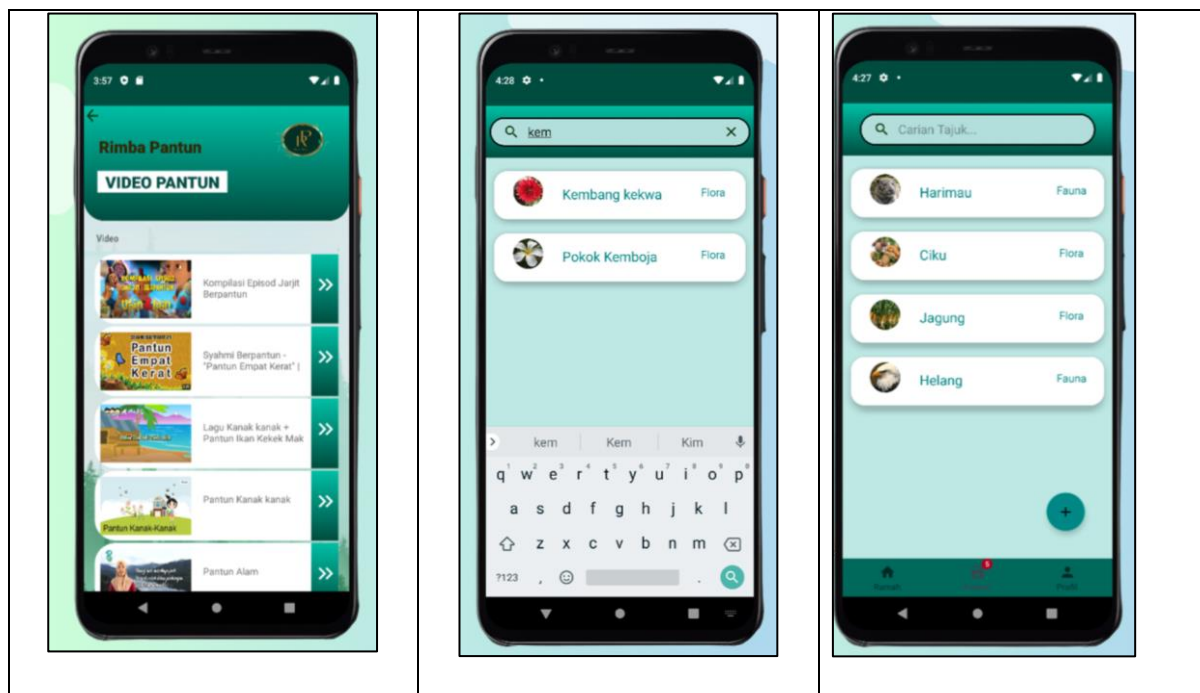


Figure 4 Info page
